Dr. Tan has been invited to address international, national and state immunization audiences on issues ranging from vaccine financing to risk management in vaccine safety to emerging infectious diseases.

Before he joined IAC, Dr. Tan was the director of medicine and public health at the American Medical Association. He was a voting member of the HHS National Vaccine Advisory Committee from 2009 to 2013 and he chaired the immunization infrastructure working group. He also served as AMA's liaison to the CDC.

Yolanda Wolff, MD, is a pediatric specialist with Children's Wisconsin. Dr. Wolff has been a leader at Children's in working through issues related to the use of telehealth for well child visits and vaccination clinics during the pandemic.
